<ul> <li>Historical Figures</li> <li>Elizabeth Cady Stanton: in 1840 after attending the World's Anti-Slavery Convention, other attendees when attempting to speak about the rights of slaves ignored Stanton. This foreshadowed her creation of the Women's Rights Convention that marked the first convention to promote equal rights for women.</li> <li>Lucretia Mott: after meeting Stanton at the Anti-Slavery Convention, the two vowed to hold a convention as soon as they returned home. She was appalled as a teacher to find that men were paid double for the same job as she.</li> <li>Frederick Douglass: A famous speaker of the Anti-Slavery Movement. Douglass was a key speaker at the Convention that supported Women's Rights.</li> </ul>	Historical Time Period Connection Fredericks Speech: As women fought for Anti-Slavery, Douglass' speech was an initiation that the 15 <sup>th</sup> amendment should also include women.

The U.S. military recruited women as translators, telephone operators, drivers, and cryptologists. Overseas and on the home front, the contributions of these groundbreaking women encouraged support for the 19th Amendment, which granted voting rights to adult females.

Temperance Movement	Education Reform
<ul> <li>Women supported the "problem" of alcoholism in America.</li> <li>The Temperance Movement was influenced in the 1850's by the Women's rights movement teamed with the Church.</li> <li>Amelia Bloomer, writer of a temperance magazine, included a sewing template for "bloomers," that received negativity because of the idea of women wearing pants.</li> </ul>	Throughout the early 1800's there were few opportunities for women's education past elementary school. Sisters, and daughters of a slaveholder; <b>Sarah and Angelia</b> <b>Grimke</b> among other arguments, spoke out against the lack of education opportunity for women. They created the first academically rigorous school for women in The women's rights supporters spoke also about women's equal jobs and pay.
Health Reform	Abolition Efforts
Throughout the Mid-19 <sup>th</sup> century, Elizabeth Blackwell, who in 1949 became the first women to graduate from medical college and open an infirmary for women and children. Catherine Beecher took a national survey about women's health, finding that 2 out of 3 women are not in good health.	Women like <b>Sarah and Angelia Grimke</b> , daughters of a slaveholder, fought for abolition, as well as women's rights. <b>The Abolitionist Movement:</b> The Abolitionist movement and women's initial efforts to support the movement were not taken seriously. It is because of the negative attention women received within the Abolitionist Movement that fueled the push for women's rights.

### Women's fight for political rights...


